Individuals who are incarcerated will build the tiny homes in a construction class. Upon completion, those who are at work release or work detail, will come to the property site and put the homes together.

There is a team of stakeholders, city council members, urban development directors, architects, and laborers who all will be playing a role in creating Hope Village.

A Peer Support Specialist will provide one on one support and planning for each resident to ensure successful reintegration back into the community after incarceration

Affordable housing is crucial to those who have been incarcerated for their successful reintegration back into society.



Individual homes differ from communal living by giving each person a feeling of worth, therefore a great buy-in to their community village.



Opportunity for people who are unsheltered to move from dangerous conditions on the streets to a safer and supportive environment.



On-site well-being opportunities including peer support, community gardening, and property management

## About Hope Village

The property and 20 tiny homes will be owned by Bridges to Hope and leased to the residents for as long as they are abiding by their lease agreements. The residents will initially pay \$1 per square foot plus utilities. The homes will range in size from 250 to 500 sq. ft. with studio, 1 bedroom and 2 bedroom options available.

There will be a community building with a large industrial kitchen, laundry facility and meeting rooms for support groups and Village Council meetings. An open green space where the residents can learn to grow their own food in a community garden will also be on-site.
